

SELF DEFENSE FOR RIDERS



Here are some ways to increase your safety & visibility while on the road



MOTORCYCLE AWARENESS MONTH

BE COLORFUL!

LIGHT IT UP

BE NOTICED!

HELP MOTORISTS SEE YOU!



Studies show that silver, white, yellow and high visibility colors are the most visible colors on the road. Black is the most difficult to see, especially at night. Brightly colored jackets, helmets, and riding pants increase your visibility and safety.

- HEADLIGHTS— Turn your headlights on high beam during the day. Modulating headlights also increases visibility and are legal in all 50 states.
- BRAKE LIGHTS— Flash your brake lights several times before you stop. Brake light deceleration devices are available, and they warn motorists that you are preparing to slow down or stop.
- TURN SIGNALS— We all know how to use turn signals, but make sure you turn them off after a turn is completed. Motorists don't always know that many motorcycles do NOT have selfcancelling turn signals.





LANE POSITIONING IS CRITICAL IN TRAFFIC. MAKE Sure you are not in a driver's blind spot!

- HORN— Use it to get attention, but don't rely on it. Some motorcycle horns can't be heard over traffic or stereo systems.
- LANE POSITIONING— Position yourself for maximum safety and visibility, and make sure other drivers can see you in their mirrors!
- GROUPS—Riding with a group can be safer than riding alone if done correctly. Small groups of 6 to 7 riders are the safest. Impatient motorists may want to pass a group of riders. If the group is too large, merging can become dangerous!

Rider Education

May is Motorist Awareness Month. This month I would like to share an article from Bruce Luhrs, the NH-VT District Educator. It is a first-hand account of something we all face every day. It is reproduced in its entirety below with his permission.

"They Looked but Failed to See"

The mission of the GWRRA Motorist Awareness Program is "To Facilitate A Reduction in Motorcycle Accidents through the Education of the Non-Motorcycle Riding Public". For Motorist Awareness Month, I'd like to share information about the most common type of car-motorcycle accident classified as a looked-but-failed-to-see crash.

While on a ride last Fall, I collided with a driver who made a left-hand turn in front-of me into his driveway. He appeared to have stopped to let me pass, but at the last minute turned into me. I was wearing a high-vis jacket, a full-face helmet with high-vis markings and riding my GL1800 Gold Wing with the headlight on. We were the only two vehicles on a long stretch of straight road. The driver said, "he never saw me". Because we believe in the GWRRA's safety mantras - ATGATT and Rider Education, I avoided serious injuries.

My wife, Sue, was baffled by the fact that "he never saw me" and spent some time researching why these types of collisions are so common. There is a very real psychological phenomenon causing this. Inattentional Blindness is defined as "a person is missing critical information even when their eyes are focused on the road ahead". There are two contributing factors:

- It can happen when you are very focused on only one thing while driving. For example, if you become hyper-focused on reaching an exit or turning into a driveway, you can miss other things happening around you on the road.
- Inattentional Blindness is also called Perceptual Blindness. Our brains cannot process every detail of our surroundings all the time, so it concentrates on what is expected to be in our surroundings. In other words, people do not always see new and unexpected things that suddenly appear within their visual field like motorcycles! As many as 92% of households do not own a motorcycle. So, we are a rare group of 8%. Plus, we do not ride all the time, especially here in the Northeast when riding is seasonal. People do not expect to see us!

There are a couple ways we can combat this dilemma – ride more and promote Motorist Awareness by displaying Check Twice – Save a Life ©, Motorcycles are Everywhere bumper stickers.

Sue and I will be in touch with each of the NH-VT District's Chapter Directors to discuss our plans to distribute some bumper stickers. These purchased from Paul Cote at http://www.checktwice-savealife.com/whose mission is to help raise awareness of drivers sharing the road with motorcycles by displaying bumper stickers, signs and

other products aimed at reducing motorcycle accidents, injuries, and fatalities. While thanking Sue for our order, Paul also thanked GWRRA members for promoting motorcycle safety awareness aimed at reducing accidents and injuries, and all the positive reflections the owners of Gold Wings generate in the riding community.

I will have raffle tickets with me at our gathering and events leading up to the raffle. Tickets are \$2.00 each.




