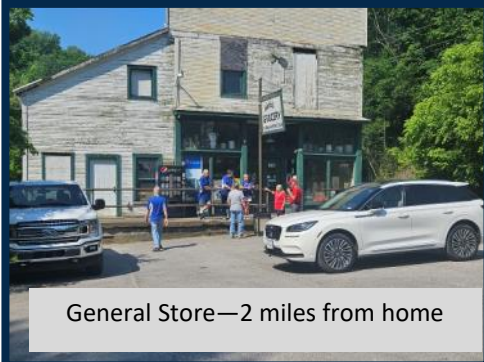
Hatfield & McCoy courthouse, a trip to Pikeville for lunch and a **SMALL** snowcone with ice cream. So good!

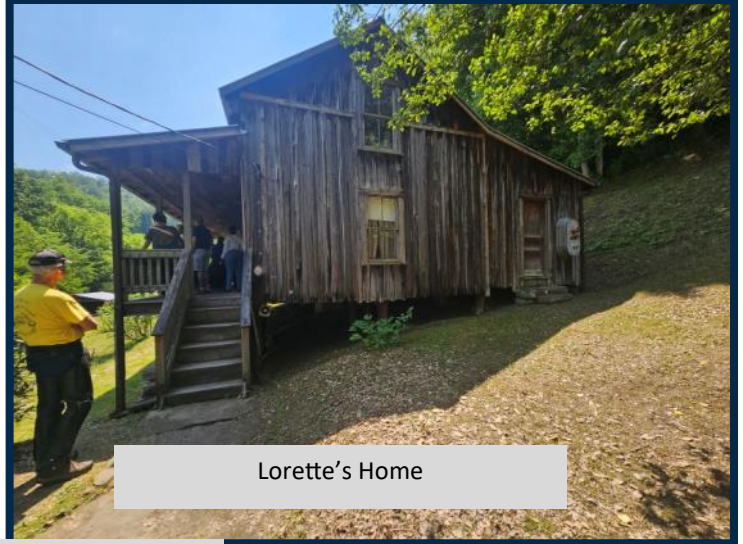

# In the Spotlight

## Paul Hartke

This month is the first of a two-part series on the “G” Men of Ice Cream. If you have ever been on a Chapter G ice cream ride, you know the pleasure of gliding through the backroads of Northern Kentucky, rarely knowing where you are, but always knowing that the evening will end with ice cream. It’s a wonderful feeling and for many, there is no better therapy, but did you ever wonder how this great G tradition came about? Well, keep reading and find out.

Paul and Jackie Hartke officially joined Chapter G in February of 1992, after finding this great group in 1991. Paul started riding motorcycles in 1974, riding a Honda 125 on dirt. He eventually graduated in 78-79 to road riding on a Honda Hawk 400. From the 400 Hawk he moved up to a 650 Hawk, and this was a trend that would continue to this day with so many makes and models. In 1991 he acquired his first Goldwing, a brand new 1500. Not stopping there, he purchased another one in 1998. Throughout the years he has owned two Harley Sportsters, one Harley Electra Glide, a Triumph Bonneville, and a Moto Guzzi. In 2007 He purchased an 1800 Goldwing and had it triked it in 2010. Paul laughingly says there may have been others he failed to mention after this many years.

Back in the early 90’s when Chapter G was still fairly new, Paul used to take weekend rides with the first Chapter Educator, Mr. John Staten. John and Paul rode in every county, and visited every state park in Kentucky, and along the way John would always want to stop somewhere during the ride for ice cream. After John passed away, remembering all the great times they shared, Paul thought it would be a good idea to have a mid-week ride and stop for ice cream, so he presented the idea to the Ride Coordinator at the time... and this is where you must wait until next month for the rest of the story.

Paul and Jackie Hartke served Chapter G as Assistant Chapter Directors from 1996 to 1999, and Paul has been leading, tailing, and riding for ice cream with the G for all these years. We appreciate his time and talents and everything he has done for our Chapter.





## Memorial—James “Jim” Morrison

On Tuesday, June 13<sup>th</sup> Chapter G lost another great member. Jim joined Chapter G in March of 2022. He loved going on the Ice Cream Rides and always had a wonderful smile to share with the group. He was an interesting fella to say the least, which you would know if you ever had the chance to talk with him. you have made an interesting ride, please send me a brief description and if possible, some pictures. Since this is the only submission received this past month, we are again highlighting a ride made by our Ride Coordinators, Steve and Lesley.

Places Visited:

Markland Dam (Rte 41, Warsaw, KY) (also nice shady picnic area and very clean restrooms)

Wagners' Village Inn (22171 Main St, Oldenburg, IN 47036)

Grannie's Cookie Jars & Ice Cream Parlor, 10107 Columbia St, Metamora, IN, over 2500 jars

Starting off on a lovely Saturday morning with friends who invited us along for a ride!

The goal was Wagner's Village Inn, Oldenburg IN, who are now famous for their award winning "hole in the wall" pan fried chicken dinners. In fact, it's the only item on the menu, so you better like chicken. We



stopped at the Markland Dam, and got to enjoy watching the process of a barge going through the locks. It doesn't sound exciting, but the process is very interesting. They have a beautiful shady picnic area with very clean restrooms too!

Next was over the bridge into Indiana and on some very nice curvy and somewhat hilly backroads. Who knew Indiana had hills and curves. The Villager Inn lunch was delicious and even though I'm not a fried chicken fan, it was moist and the coating was flavorful.

Now, after a good lunch, you need ice cream. So, it was on to Metamora to see Grannie's Cookie Jars and Ice Cream Parlor, which is only 10 or so miles from Oldenburg.

Grannie's has over 2500 cookie jars on display and they offer ice cream (as do most shops in Metamora), but Grannie's has homemade waffle cones, and it's only \$3.00. They have a shaded patio outside to sit and enjoy it. You can also watch the hummingbirds battle over the nectar in the 3 feeders.

As a bonus in Metamora, they have a scenic train ride and once a year they have a Wild West ride that starts in Connersville and has a 2-hour layover in Metamora. Think, characters in wild west costume and a shootout in the town square between the law and the bank robbers! We were lucky enough to be there just in time to see the shootout! If shopping is your thing, Metamora has many little antique shops to browse.

For the way back, we took the Rising Star ferry - it's FREE for all of 2023. A quick ride over to Rabbit Hash and then home.

Good ride/good company. One tank of gas, 211 miles of smiles!

If you want a shorter ride, it could be fun to take a picnic lunch (my thought is a Subway sandwich) and eat at the Markland Dam in the shade. You could then ride over the bridge and along the river to Rising Star and take the FREE ferry back over to Kentucky.

# MOTORCYCLE SAFETY TIPS

## Be Mindful of Your Bike

Can you easily get on and off the bike? Do your feet rest flat on the ground when seated?

Can you comfortably reach the handlebars and controls?

Make sure your headlights, tail lights, and signals are working perfectly.

Anti-lock brakes can save your life! Bikes with ABS are **37%** less likely to be involved in a fatal crash.

Regularly check coolant, oil, and fuel levels to avoid unexpected breakdowns.

Don't choose an engine that's too powerful. New riders or commuters should choose a 250-300cc engine. Highway riders should choose 500-750cc.

Regularly ensure your tire pressure and tread depth are within the specified levels.

## Never Say Never

Today was June 18, 2023, a Father's Day that did not appear to be much different than most other days in my life. At the end of this day, I am feeling much different about something that I thought would never happen.

It all started back on August 16<sup>th</sup>, 2019. I led a group of Chapter G folks from Northern Kentucky to Cave City to partake in the 2018 KY Blast festivities. It had been raining most of the way down, but upon arrival the rain had stopped, and the sun was out. I decided to remove my rain pants, and while doing so I dislocated my left hip joint, which resulted in an ambulance ride to a hospital in Glasgow, KY. With the abilities of a great lady doctor and several assistants, they were able to relocate the joint. During this painful ordeal, many thoughts went through my mind. It seems that in the previous week I had three other incidents on my trike where only by luck I had avoided serious injury or possible death. From being forced off the highway twice and a near miss of another vehicle running a red light, it occurred to me as I left the hospital someone might be trying to tell me something, and I should end my riding days while I still had days left, so that was exactly what I did.

Until today, I had not ridden on a motorcycle since then. Did I miss riding?? You bet I did! You don't stop doing something that you started 57 years earlier and just quit cold turkey without missing it. I missed it every day. I would sit on my porch and watch motorcycles riding through our town. Every time I would see my friends on the weekly Ice Cream rides or hear them speaking of their weekend or long-distance rides to wherever...sure, I missed it.

So, this afternoon when my friend Donita

offered to take me a ride on her newly acquired trike, I readily accepted. Since I still had my helmet which still had the radio headset attached, I slowly made my way onto the passenger seat. With some nervous anticipation we were on our way. I have ridden thousands and thousands of miles on bikes but have spent very little time as a passenger. The view from the back seat gave me a totally different perspective than I always had as a driver. At first, I was very apprehensive. Not being in control was difficult. Going around curves and following the flow of traffic took some getting used to. I asked her to stop at Big Bone Park to discuss some thoughts I had about her riding technique. While she is fairly new, not at riding, but at riding a trike, I thought she should hear what I had to offer. She so graciously listened to what I had to say and agreed to take what I was saying under advisement.

We spent the rest of the afternoon enjoying a beautiful, leisurely day touring the countryside of Boone County: through Big Bone, Rabbit Hash, Petersburg, Idlewild, Burlington, and back to Walton. As I dismounted, many thoughts were running through my head; thoughts I never would believe I would ever have again.

Later this evening my son and his wife came by for a Father's Day visit, and after telling them about my day, my son asked "Dad, are you getting another Trike?" My response was simply, "Jeff, I will never say never", and left it at that.

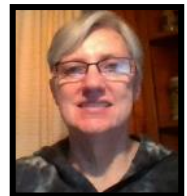

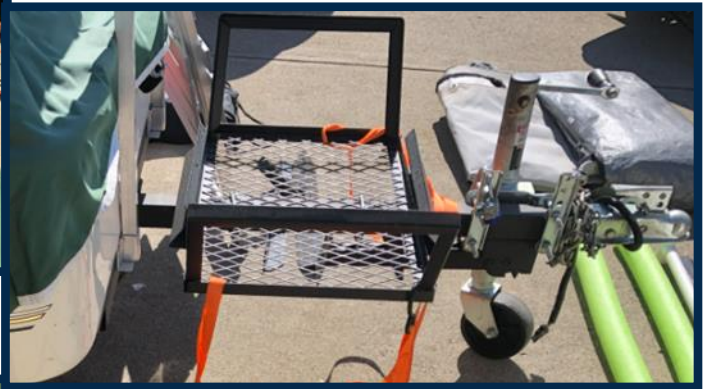
