## **Chapter G Dinner Ride**


March found Chapter G meeting first to bowl, then dinner at Harmon's Barbecue. It was a fun time for those who participated, We have some good bowlers in the Chapter.

### Who's that guy?

Who's that guy sitting down there by himself?"; That's where it all began. A group of us from Chapter G were camping at the Horse Park with some of the Central Kentucky Riders when we noticed a guy with a Leesure-Lite sitting down the row all alone. Some of the guys went down to have a chat with him and that is how Deward Brake was introduced to Chapter G. Since that fateful day I have been blessed to get to know one of the most interesting guys I've ever met.

Deward grew up on a farm, with outside plumbing. He got his first bike at the age of 14, a motor scooter that replaced his old LPC (leather personnel carriers...boots, to us civilians). His first bike after the scooter was a 1956 Harley Davidson Hummer. Wanting to do more with his life than farming, he joined the Army, which turned out to be a blessing; giving him more control over his future , and allowing him to make more money while doing something he really enjoyed...driving.

Deward trained as a Heavy Truck Driver and was sent to Germany. From there he was sent to SHAPE (Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers Europe) in Paris, France to serve as a chauffeur. SHAPE is the military arm of NATO. This was General Eisenhower's command during WW2. He was in Paris for 17 months and another 13 months in Belgium, and was the official driver for six "4-star" Army and Air Force Generals.

In 1968 Deward was reassigned to Ft. Hood, Texas, and in 1969 was sent to Vietnam one week after his brother Boyd, a Marine, was killed in Action. He completed his year of duty in Vietnam with the 14th Cavalry in July, 1970. His favorite Army memories were of traveling around Europe with his friend Ken Meske, and he fondly remembers all the pictures of the pair of them in their suits and ties. Chauffeurs had to look nice, you know. The two of them were even at Le Mans the year Ford came in 1st, 2nd, and 3rd.

Deward retired from Regular Army in 1976 with 3 Bronze Stars, a Purple Heart, Meritorious Service, 3 Army Commendations and an Air Force Commendation as well. One month later he joined the Kentucky National Guard full time.



### Who's that guy?

I had the honor of traveling with Deward on several Western Trips, the last one being in 2012 when we toured Glacier National Park, Yellowstone, and Grand Tetons. Our last night on the road I bought him a steak dinner in Iowa after 436 miles on the road that day, and another 436 the next day to get home. To-tal trip was 5,059 miles. It was a great trip despite the fact that 4 of us went out and only 2 came back (LOL)...but that's another story.

Deward said that his favorite ride story was a solo Western trip he took in 1992 following the Lewis and Clark Trail on an 1100 Gold Wing that was built in 1960. During that trip he pulled into a camp spot late, put up his tent and went to sleep. It wasn't until morning when he got up that he saw the sign, "NO CAMPING...BEARS!" He returned from the trip with duct tape holding the bike together and tons of memories of the road.

We go to our monthly gatherings and chat with our friends every month. Sometimes we get close, and sometimes we are just acquaintances, but the truth is, we are surrounded by amazing people who have lived amazing lives. Heroes are all around us. Consider taking the time to get to know their stories and then you will truly know how special our Chapter G family really is.

# **Rider Education**

Signs, signs, everywhere are signs! When I ride, this catchy tune often pops in my head. While you may disagree with the message in the song written by Les Emmerson of the Five Man Electrical Band, it is true there are many different types of signs posted along our highways, all designed to provide information about traffic and highway conditions ahead. In the early days of motor vehicles, there were no standards, and no road markings either. In 1911, the first center line was painted on a road in Cleveland. In 1915, the first STOP sign was planted in Detroit, followed five years later by the first three color traffic light, also in Detroit.

Today we have the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, or MUTCD, that sets a minimum standard for all highway signs so that everyone can better understand the information they offer. First issued on November 7, 1935, this manual defines the meaning behind each shape and color of the signs in use. And it is reviewed and amended as needed at regular intervals.

The color of roadway signs is an important indicator of the information they contain. Each color is also defined with a pantone number for uniformity. The use of red (187) on signs is limited to stop, yield, and actions that are prohibited like NO PARKING. A white background indicates a regulatory sign, such as speed limit signs. Red and white signs indicate laws applicable to that section of highway. Yellow (116) conveys a general warning message, such as signs posted to indicate curvy roads or pavement that may be slippery when wet. Green (342) shows permitted traffic movements or directional guidance. These are commonly seen along our interstate highways indicating exits and travel lane details. Fluorescent yellow/ green (382) indicates pedestrian crossings and school zones. Orange (152) is used for warning and guidance in construction zones, and like regulatory signs, indicate laws that are required to be observed. Coral (198), a pink color, is used for incident management signs. Blue (294) indicates road user services like rest areas and handicapped parking, tourist information, and evacuation routes. And brown (469) is for guidance to sites of public recreation or cultural interest like parks and recreation areas.

The shape of a sign can also alert roadway users to the type of information displayed on a sign. Traffic regulations are conveyed in rectangular signs that are taller than they are wide, or square. Other shapes used for regulatory signs are octagons for stop and inverted triangles for yield. Diamond-shaped signs signify warnings. Rectangular signs that are wider than they are tall provide guidance information. Pentagons indicate school zones, and circular signs warn of railroad crossings.




# **Couple of the Year**


