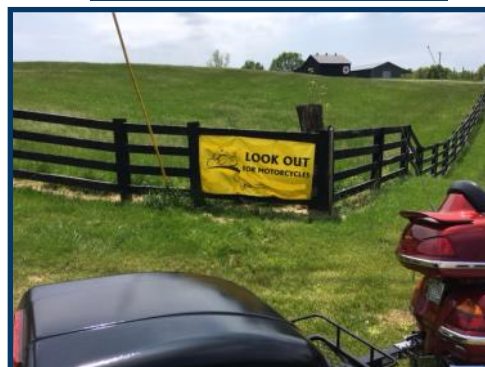

In the Spotlight

Chuck McWilliams

I first came to know Chuck McWilliams back in the 60's in his racing days. He used to race at Tri-County Speedway, near my old stomping grounds. Imagine my surprise when I joined Chapter "G" and discovered he was a member! Good ole' Chuck has led an interesting life and I thought maybe you "G" folks might like to get to know him a little better.

Chuck started racing just a few years out of high school back around 1956. He was drawn to the sport by the idea of being able to drive real fast ...legally, and didn't mind the fact that the girls seemed to like race car drivers too. His first big win came at my hometown track, the 1/2 mile banked dirt track, running the 100 lap Tri-County Speedway Championship. He went on to win 29 races at Tri-County in a two year time-span. He ran at many tracks in many states, but most of his championship wins were right here in the tri-state with many of them being at our own Florence Speedway. To this day you can't go to a race with him where he is not acknowledged or called out by race fans and sometimes even the announcer if he is spotted. In 2008 he was inducted into The Dirt Track Hall of Fame,

His most memorable race was with Richard Petty and Bobby Unger in a USAC race at Knoxville, Iowa for a 100 mile race on a 1 mile dirt track. The longest race he ever ran was at Pocono, on a 2.5 mile track for a 500 mile run where he finished 3rd. He also ran at Daytona and Talladega on the 2.5 mile high banked paved tracks. When I asked him how it felt to run on the famous tracks, he said it's a whole different race on pavement than it is on dirt, especially considering that he was able to run 186 miles per hour on the Daytona track. What a thrill!!

He raised enough money through racing to open his salvage business in Union, and set himself up with a second career. He raised a family and there are now 4 generations of winning racers in the McWilliams clan, all the way down to his great-grandson who is now racing dirt bikes.

Chuck's first motorcycle was a Suzuki touring bike that Harry Sparrow got him to buy. His first Goldwing was a 1500, which was later swapped for a trike. Chuck enjoyed many great rides out west and even a trip to Alaska. A few of his favorite "G" trips were to Wing Ding at the Grand Ole' Opry and to Wing Over the Smokies in Asheville, where they all went to visit the Biltmore.

McWilliams Wins USAC 100-Lapper

Chuck McWilliams, 1918, and 1929 track champion won the United States Auto Club 100-lap stock car feature at Tri County Speedway, driving the Foster Langan Monte Carlo.

The lead then went to Verlin Baker of Cedar Rapids, Iowa who maintained this spot from the 78th lap through No. 94. On lap No. 94, McWilliams shot to the lead as the second turn. Baker continued to knock on the door to no avail as McWilliams took the checkered.

Ralph Latham, 1918 track champion, driving the Morgan Chandler Moate Carlo led the pack from the start to the 78th lap when he blew a tire and had to retire to the pits. Ralph led two laps on the tire change and came back out before retiring permanently to the pits with mechanical problems.

Some feature leaders went to Bill Davis with Jim Tobes second.

Stock car racing resumes at Tri County Speedway Saturday night with three trials at 7 and racing at 8.

Rider Education

When we ride in groups, especially if we have riders that are unknown to the group, and they do not know our group, we need to be communicating with each other while on the road. For this purpose, the CB radio is a great tool, but only one person at a time can convey information. However, common hand signals can be used by everyone at any time and can be a faster way to relay important information.



Speed Up Inexperienced groups will benefit most from this signal. Experienced groups rely more on body language. Use it to tell the rest of the group to match your pace by increasing their speed. Extend your arm and swing your palm in an upward direction to give the signal.



Slow Down This signal is useful because motorcycles generate intense engine-braking forces, which do not activate the rear-facing brake light. Extend your arm and swing your palm down toward the road to tell everyone in the group to slow down.



Follow Me Used to announce a new, often self-appointed group leader. Also used to segment a large group into a smaller group. Make the signal by extending your arm forward at the shoulder with your palm facing outward.



You Lead/Come AKA the "YOU! Follow me!" signal. It has 2 distinct parts. Start by pulling up alongside the rider you want to follow or lead. In one motion, point to their bike and then swing your arm forward. Repeat this motion until the other rider understands.



Road Hazard This is a "2 in 1" signal. The signal is different depending on whether the hazard is to the right or the left. If the hazard is on the left, point with your left arm. Point with your right foot if the hazard is on the right.



Single File An easy gesture. Extend your left index finger and bend your arm up to the sky. In other words, pretend the riders behind you are asking "How many?" and then indicate the answer by gesturing with your left pointer finger.

Rider Education



Double File Bend your left arm at the elbow and point to the sky with your index and middle fingers. Do not forget to include your index finger.



Turn Signal On To make a “blinking” gesture using your left hand, alternate between extending your fingers and making a fist. Use this signal to let another rider know he left his blinker on, allowing him to save face during the next comfort or refreshment stop.



Pull Off Indicate to the rest of the group to pull off of the highway, either immediately or at the next exit. The pull off signal is given when the reason for the stop is something other than a comfort or refreshment stop.



Fuel When riding with most groups, running out of gas will earn you a nickname you probably won't like. Communicate your need to refuel by pointing to your fuel tank using your left index finger.

Please be courteous to your fellow riders, and signal important points as necessary. Also, when another rider signals, be sure to pass it back for everyone else.
