Gary Heil

This month we are spotlighting Gary Heil. Gary currently serves Chapter G as our Awards coordinator, but did you know that the Heil's were also our Ride Coordinators and Couple of the Year? But these jobs, although challenging, don't hold a candle to being a U.S. Postal Inspector. Gary started working at the Post office as a seasonal employee in 1965. Then, fresh out of high school in 1966 he found himself working at the Newport Post Office which serviced Newport, Bellview, Dayton, Highland Heights, and the surrounding areas, making \$1.92 per hour. I know it doesn't sound like much, but it could go a long way back then.

Gary is a Veteran and served in the Army Reserve from 1970-1976. When he got out, he went to the DC Training School for Postal Inspectors, and from there, spent the rest of his working career fighting Postal Crimes. Now your mind is racing, but I assure you, mail fraud, money laundering, and theft are serious business. Gary had to carry a gun, and had the authority to arrest people if necessary. In the late 70's he was on some big-time task-force involving mail fraud. He traveled quite a bit doing interviews and handling investigations. There are lots of crimes that the Postal Inspectors solve, but the FBI takes credit for it. That's why you don't hear much about them, but they are out there protecting citizens every day.

Gary knew at an early age that he wanted to ride motorcycles. At the age of 18, he partnered with his older brother to buy "their" first bike; a 150CC Ducati. That small bike opened a whole new world for him. In 1997 he purchased a 1995 BMW 1100LT with the intention of adding a side car. One of his favorite trips was to the BMW Rally in Vermont. They travelled on to Acadia before returning home.

His next big bike was the 2004 Goldwing which he purchased from Texas. He recalls that day when he headed to the airport, in full riding gear, no luggage, on a one-way ticket. Of course, TSA was all over that and he was detained, but did get the bike. To this one, he added a sidecar, and the fun began because now he could take Darlene and Raven. Gary enjoyed all the trips he took, seeing lots of National Parks and Historic sites with the family, and all the "Real Men" Trips he took as well. Yellowstone is by far his favorite National Park.

Considering all the places he has visited: National Parks, Niagara Falls, the Catskills, and fun trips to the Baseball Hall of Fame, Ben & Jerry's, and L.L. It was a Friday night, and he was visiting with his cousin who was home from the Navy. There was another cousin there who had a friend with her, and this friend wanted to take a ride on the bike. That simple short ride must have been really special, because he ended up spending his life with that young girl, and this month marks his and Darlene's 52 anniversary.



Now that it is May, we are ready to hit the road and ride. While we each have our own favorite way to ride and places to go, we all share one thing in common – we all need gasoline* to run our motorcycles. Gasoline holds a lot of energy. What other common, legal, affordable (relatively speaking), and readily available substance is able to propel a 3,500-pound object 30 miles? Because we all use gasoline every day, it is easy to lose the respect we should have for it considering the potential danger of mishandling it.

Here are a few tips I found when fueling your motorcycle.

Turn off your engine. Besides being a federal law, it just makes sense. If the fuel was to spill as you bring the nozzle to and from the filler neck, or as a result of an overfill, the risk of fire is much greater if the engine is running due to the heat of the engine and the spark from the active ignition.

Take your helmet off. The rising fumes, which are not healthful (and known in California as a carcinogen) may get trapped under your helmet visor and create a toxic cloud around your head. Also, if your helmet is still connected to your audio system by a cable, it may be more difficult to get away if the fuel was to ignite.

Get off the motorcycle. If you spill gasoline, your clothing may get wet. Then what do you do? Yes, it will evaporate, but it is the fumes of gasoline that burn, not the liquid itself. In fact, and I do not recommend testing this, but if you take a lit match and place it fast enough into a container of gasoline, the match will be extinguished, without starting a fire. You must at once drench the effected clothing with water and then remove them. Do not walk anywhere with gasoline on your clothes. Static electricity may cause the fuel to ignite. And it can cause a chemical burn to your skin if allowed to stay in contact long enough.

Turn off your ignition, all electrical accessories, and especially your mobile phone. Do not smoke within 20 feet of the pump. This is also federal law.

A fire at a fuel pump happens somewhere in the United States almost every day. Be smart, obey the rules, and stay safe.

*It is true there are motorcycles using sources of energy and propulsion systems not requiring gasoline, but these are still in the vast minority.

½ Cup Sugar

1/2 Cup White Vinegar

¼ Cup Water

1/4 Cup Bacon Drippings from frying 1/2 pound of bacon-fried crisp (cut into pieces)

Before heating – mix 1 heaping T. of flour with 2 T. cold water (whisk until smooth). Add to other mixture. Heat altogether until boiling and thickened. Pour over potatoes and mix.






