








Memorial—Asa M. Rouse






Asa Rouse, 93, lifelong resident of Walton, KY, passed away on Friday, August 4, 2023, at St. Elizabeth Hospice in Edgewood, KY. The son of the late William Wendall Rouse and Louise {Jack} Rouse, Asa was born in Walton on July 11, 1930. He married the love of his life, Elizabeth "Libby" Rouse on June 18, 1952, she passed away on August 26, 2016.


Asa obtained his Juris Doctor Degree from the University of Kentucky, College of Law, in 1953. Before graduating, he was a college student council member and member of the Legal Honorary Fraternity. After graduation, he was a member of the Board of Trustees of the Law College Alumni Association between 1979 and 1981. He then went on to become the Boone County District Judge, by appointment, from 1964 to 1973 and then served on the Kentucky Supreme Court in 1983. He owned and operated his law firm, Rouse & Rouse, which was recognized in 1988 as the Pro Bono Firm of the Year by the Legal Aid Society.

Over the years, Asa obtained many professional and non-professional awards and commendations. He received the Certificate of Achievement from the Northern Kentucky Bar Association in 1998, Title of Senior Counselor from the Kentucky Bar Association in 2003, Honorary Master of the Bench from the Salmon P. Chase American Inn of Court in 2004, and the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Northern Kentucky Bar Association in 2006. The Gold Wing Road Riders Association designated him Master Tour Rider in 2004 and Senior Chapter Educator for Chapter G and was awarded the Mileage Award in 2003 after traveling 26,692 miles in one year on a motorcycle and the Kentucky Educator of the Year in 2004.

He was a member of Walton United Methodist Church and held memberships with the Board of Directors of Star Bank, Kentucky Bar Association, Northern Kentucky Bar Association, Board of Trustees of the Kentucky Judicial Retirement System, Board of Trustees of the Kentucky Legislators Retirement System, Board of Trustees of Booth Memorial Hospital (where he also served two terms as Chairman of the Board), Chairman of Woodspoint Nursing Home, Committee of the Kentucky Hospital Association, Advisory Council for the Kentucky Cabinet for Human Resources, the Woman's Crisis Center, American forestry Association, Board of Directors of Verona Bank for 25 years, Foundation Board of St. Luke Hospitals East & West, Merit Board of the Boone County Police Department, Judicial Nomination Commission of Kentucky, American Motorcyclist Association, Howdy Boys Social Club, Walton-Verona Businessmen's Association, Restoration Committee of Gaines Historical Home, Dixie Guys Luncheon Club, Gold Wing Road Riders Association, and the Central Kentucky Riders.



Exploring and touring are two of the reasons we ride motorcycles. Over the years I have visited many museums, National and State Parks, monuments and assorted oddities on rides across the country and close to home. Just this year, I have been to two unique museums while on Chapter G rides. In April, the lunch ride was to New Richmond, Ohio which is home to the "World's Only Cardboard Boat Racing Museum" and an annual Cardboard Boat Regatta. Boats are constructed to resemble "real boats" such as the Island Queen, automobiles, airplanes and animals. Th staff will offer tips on building your own cardboard boat so you can enter the annual race. If you do not want to build your own, you can purchase raffle tickets to win one built by the staff. By the way, New Richmond claims to be "America's Cardboard Boat Racing Capital."

In August, the Chapter lunch ride was to Hillbilly Hot Dogs in Lesage, WV. There are no words to describe the décor for this establishment. Some may consider the decorations antiques while others say it is junk. Jerry Williams counted at least 12 Singing Billy Bass plaques in various locations on the property. You will need to attend the September gathering to see the videos and photos of the facility. After lunch, we proceeded to Point Pleasant, WV to view the Mothman Statute and "The world's only Mothman Museum." This was a learning experience for me as I knew nothing about "Mothman". Point Pleasant had been the site of a World War II Munition plant. On November 15, 1966, two young couples were driving near the old plant when they saw a large white creature whose eyes "glowed red", standing at the side of the road. One of them described it as a "slender, muscular man" about seven feet tall with white wings, and said that she was unable to discern its face due to the hypnotic effect of its eyes. The witnesses drove away at high speed, and said that the creature flew after their car, making a screeching sound. It followed them as far as the Point Pleasant city limits. Subsequently, others reported seeing the creature. The county sheriff and a West Virginia University biologist speculated it was a sandhill crane. The name "Mothman" was derived from the fictional superheros of that

timeframe. On December 15, 1967 the Silver Bridge between Point Pleasant and Gallipolis, OH collapsed causing the death of 46 people. The incident gave rise to the legend and connected the Mothman sightings to the bridge collapse. The "Mothman" was also sighted at the scene of other disasters around the world. The legend grew with the publishing of a book entitled *Mothman Prophecies* in 1975 and the release of a major motion picture of the same name which was loosely based on the book in 2002.

I hope everyone that attended the 2023 Kentucky Blast enjoyed the event. There were many games to play and great riding opportunities available during a week in August of lower-than-normal temperatures. There were also educational opportunities supported by the RPM Academy training curriculum. Even the game at the Rider Ed table offered a chance to learn about different road signs, and you could also learn about the importance of hand strength and how the use of your right-hand fingers affects your ability to stop your motorcycle.

Motorcycling is a physical activity that requires the operator to have a certain amount of strength to control the motorcycle safely and effectively. Nearly every bike made has a hand brake lever, normally for the front brake, and a foot brake lever, normally for the rear brake. (Some scooters I have seen and ridden have only hand brake levers, with one for the front brake and one for the rear brake.) Some motorcycles have combined or linked braking arrangements, such that some rear braking is included when the hand lever for the front brake is activated, and some front braking is included when the foot pedal for the rear brake is activated. Regardless of how the braking system is engineered, as much as 80% of the total braking power of the motorcycle is in the front brakes, making strong hands necessary to safely ride your vehicle.

Beginning riders are normally taught to use all four fingers when applying the brake, and at all other times to leave the fingers on the handgrip. More advanced riders can learn about alternate techniques of using one, two, or three fingers to cover the brake lever. There are several reasons for using any of these techniques, and there are right and wrong times to cover the brake. Covering the brake is simply holding one, two, or three fingers over or just on top of the brake lever. The benefit of this is a faster reaction time when needing to apply the brakes, since your fingers are already extended. It is possible that as much as a quarter second can be saved by covering the brake. At 60 miles an hour, that quarter of a second translates into 22 feet, or more than an average car length. The drawbacks to covering the brake include decreased ability to apply full pressure to the lever, the potential to roll on the throttle while braking, and the potential in slow speed maneuvers to drop the motorcycle by inadvertently applying the front brake.

Several people who used the strength gage available at the Rider Ed table found out just how much difference there is between a two finger and a four finger pull on the brake lever. Regardless of your riding experience, using all four fingers supplies the strongest pull on the lever, which is nearly twice the power of a two finger pull. I find that reducing my pull on the brake lever is easier than trying to apply more pressure, especially if I am already trying to apply the most pressure possible.


