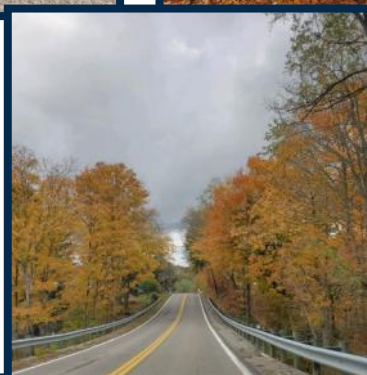

Mother Nature truly put on a spectacular array of fall colors for the October trip to Nelsonville, Ohio out in the Hocking Hills area.

Most people opted to make their own way to Nelsonville, with a few of us getting lost (actually taking an unplanned side trip to Iron Pony Motorsports. If you haven't been, it's the superstore of all things motorcycle! Not an inexpensive side trip, but we got some good bargains and some gear for next year.

The Lodge at Hocking College was very welcoming, and the rooms were just as pictured when I initially found their website. The students in the forestry and woodworking programs did an amazing job on the furniture. It was so nice to stay somewhere that didn't look like every other hotel room.

Dinner at the Rhapsody Restaurant, in the downtown History Public Square which is run by the college students in the Culinary Arts program was absolutely delicious. The building was once a five and dime store and had some beautiful brick work and an old bar that had supposedly been won in a poker game in the 1940's.

The ride out on some of the Windy 9 roads was beautiful...curvy, hilly and full of fall color. Our goal was to see the Big Muskie Bucket that had been built on site over a 2-year period in the mid 1960's to dig coal. Only the bucket remains, and that is massive. It was hard to imagine the size of the machine itself (22 stories tall) that powered the bucket, which could hold a volume equivalent to that of a 12-car garage. It was dismantled in 1991 due to the cost of operation. We were all pleased to learn that the area has been turned into a conservation area with re-forestation efforts!

We found a great little Diner in a small town nearby to stop for lunch and then headed back to town for our dinner at the Hocking Hills Country Club. Food again was delicious, and our table looked out on the golf course with some pretty fall color.

The next day found some of us shopping, and some of us doing some more sight-seeing, and then a scenic train ride on the Hocking Valley Scenic Railway, with a stop at the Pioneer Village on the college campus, before our last dinner at Old Dutch.

Evenings as usual, found us gathering for some adult beverages and lots of lively conversation, good laughs and some pretty late bedtimes (thanks, Stephen Poat)!

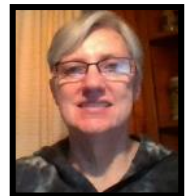

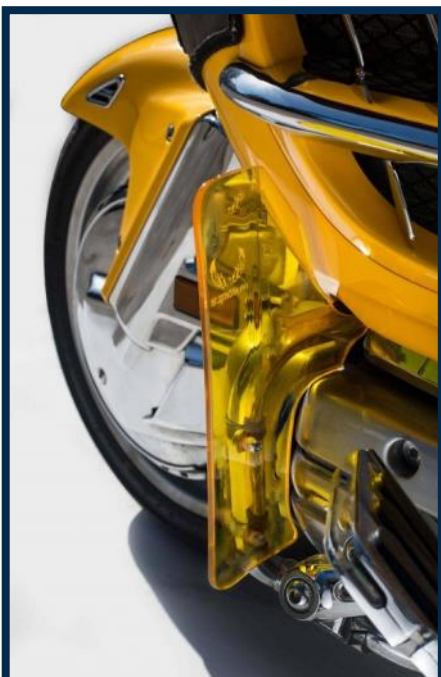
