CHAPTER DIRECTOR

We've reached the end of 2023 and soon we will close the book on this one. Our first year as Wing'D Rider has been a learning curve as we got to know the new organization and they continue to evolve. Wing'D has come a long way in the past year. They still face some challenges, the biggest of which is membership. No organization can survive without members. You gain members through offering benefits and earning the trust of the members. Trust is gained over time, which is one thing that they have not yet had. But they are working through issues the best that they can. As a group, we were used to a large organization, that had many employees and an office/ corporate headquarters in Phoenix. Our new organization has no office and borrows the employees of J & M to make everything happen. They have done a wonderful job of answering any questions that I have had for them, and of solving issues that I have brought to their attention. If you have questions that you need answered before you renew, there is a help line on the website, or you can email them at support@wingdrider.com.

As for benefits, in October, they presented us with WRTOW, a deeply discounted motorcycle tow package that operates through MTS (Motorcycle Towing Service). MTS operates in the US and Canada and is a family-owned business founded in 1987 by a Vietnam Veteran by the name of Gene Wagner. The company is now run by his son-in-law and offers a Premier Plan and a Deluxe Plan. The Premier Plan pays the first \$300 of your tow from point of pick-up to point of delivery. It is \$50 per year to cover one bike or \$95 to cover two. The Deluxe Plan covers the first \$150 and costs \$25 per year for one bike and \$45 for two. These are Wing'D Rider member prices, with regular prices being almost double.

Speaking of Wing'D membership, the organization cannot survive without members. I had

someone tell me they were on the fence about renewing. If this is the case for you, think about all the fun times that you have had with Chapter G...about all the people that you never would have met if you hadn't joined the Chapter. No organization can survive without funding. If you visualize a church where everyone goes, but nobody gives an offering, how long do you think that church would survive? We are a not-for-profit organization. We must have membership to survive. Does that mean that your friendships will fall apart? That would depend on many different variables, but without a place to meet as a group and socialize, and the tax benefits and insurance of belonging to an organization, Chapter G would not be the same group that it is today. For the cost of a couple of meals out, you can help ensure that we can remain the same fun-loving, traveling, riding, and social group that we now are. Please renew your membership.

The Christmas party is up next on 12/2 at Kelly's Homestead in Dry Ridge. We will have the Dirty Santa Gift exchange, toy donations, great food, and a show. The December Get-Together on 12/5 will be fun and games with Dirty Bingo. For my last article for 2023, I thought I would share some technical information about lithium, a chemical element of the [alkali metal](#) group that is the lightest metal known and one that is used especially in alloys and glass, in mechanical lubricants, and in storage batteries. In the periodic table, its symbol is Li, its atomic weight is 6.939, its atomic number is 3, and its specific gravity is 0.53 at 20°C.

Lithium is the 33rd most abundant element on Earth, but it does not naturally occur in its pure form due to its high reactivity. Lithium metal, due to its alkaline properties, is corrosive and reacts with water. Breathing lithium dust or alkaline lithium compounds irritates respiratory tracts. Prolonged exposure to lithium can cause nervous system disorders, and it can cause fluid to build-up in the lungs, leading to pulmonary edema. The metal itself is a handling hazard because of the caustic hydroxide produced when it is in contact with water, which can cause an explosion.

There are three sources of lithium: underground mines, surface clay, recycling, and brine water. [87 percent](#) of the world's lithium comes from the brine water, with the [highest lithium concentrations](#) found in Bolivia, Argentina, and Chile.

Lithium mining carries high environmental costs. Mining companies operating in the salt plains of South America, which are essentially high deserts, require extensive extraction operations and use nearly two-thirds of the available fresh water, leaving very little for farming and livestock.

The smallest currently available source of lithium is that contained in recycled electronics. While lithium recycling is not yet capable of yielding material pure enough for reuse in batteries, it can be used in glass and ceramics, the second-largest lithium-consuming industry after the manufacturing of lithium-ion batteries.

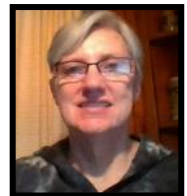

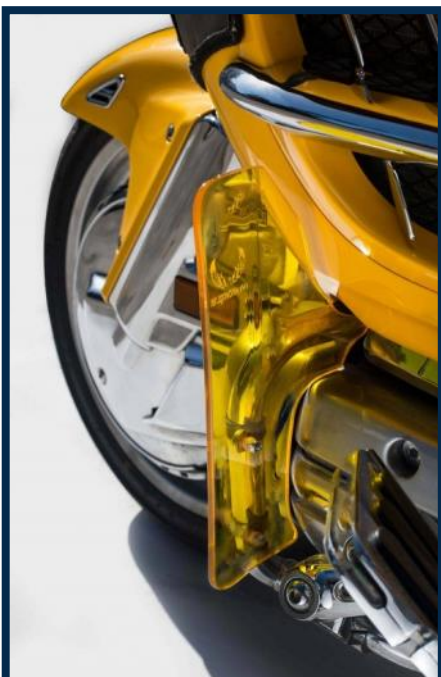
