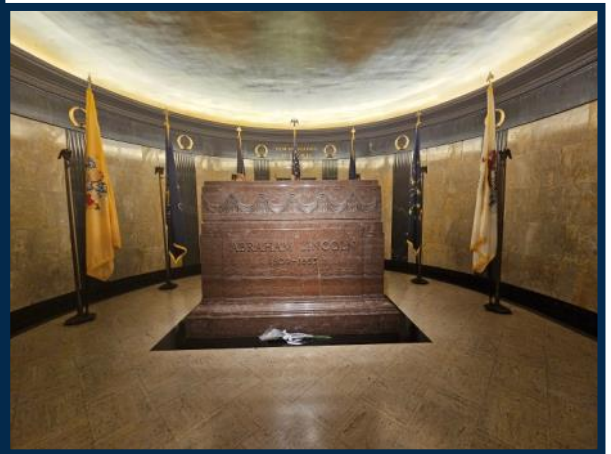

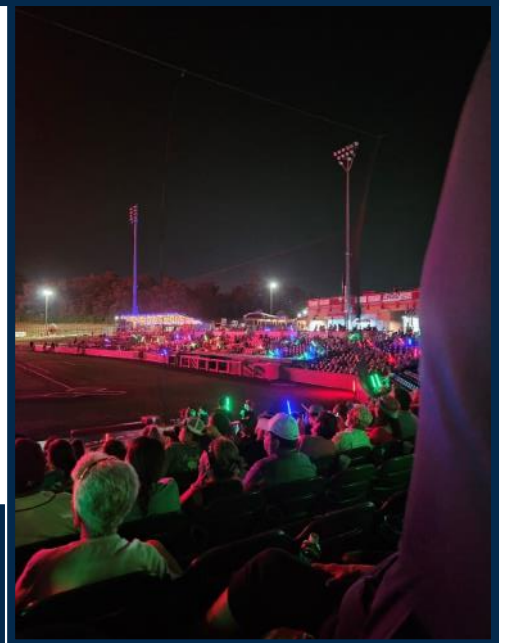

Thank you, Steve C for all you have done and continue to do for our chapter.

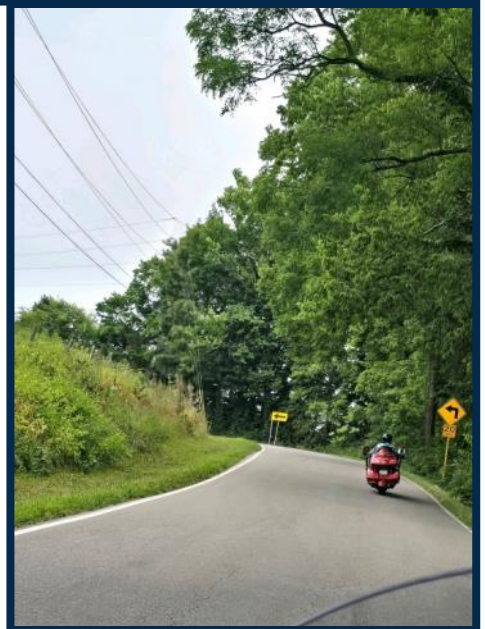

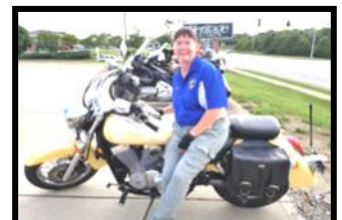

In May, my son and I spent a week riding in Arkansas. We rode many great “motorcycle roads” including U S 62 from I-49 in Bentonville to U S 67 in Corning, AR on our return trip home. U S 62 is designated as a Scenic Highway as it traverses the state through the Ozark Mountains. We rode 261 of the 330 miles in Arkansas. We reconnected with U S 62 in Wickliffe, KY and followed it to Paducah. As we rode the Interstates and Parkways through Kentucky, I wondered how many miles of U S 62 are in our wonderful state and what I could see if I rode it from border to border.

The terminuses of U S 62 in Kentucky are Wickliffe in the western part of the state and Maysville in the East. It crosses the Ohio River at both points. It covers 391 miles across 20 counties. Starting in Mason County, one would pass through Maysville and Washington. Maysville is home to the Kentucky Gateway Museum Center which “illuminates the past through award-winning dioramas, more than 4,000 regional artifacts and a gallery of fine art related to Maysville and Kentucky.” It also presents the history of bourbon and the Old Pogue distillery. We have not visited this museum but from the website it sounds like it would be a nice place to visit.

The second county you would encounter is Robinson County. The road between Maysville and Cynthiana is a two-lane country road without any shoulders. A great motorcycle road. A slight detour in Mount Olivet will take you to Blue Licks Battlefield State Resort Park. The Chapter has visited here numerous times. Continuing on U S 62 takes you through Cynthiana, Georgetown then Versailles. All of these cities have been destinations for various Chapter G Rides and events. You can visit The Kentucky Horse Park in Georgetown or visit several distilleries in the area. Continuing southwest, the highway parallels the Bluegrass Parkway passing through Bardstown home to some of the biggest distilleries in the Commonwealth. It is also home to My Old Kentucky Home State Park. Continuing through Elizabethtown, U S 62 parallels the Western Kentucky Parkway. In Dawson Springs, a detour down State Route 109 takes you to Pennyryle Forest State Resort Park. Once you reach Eddyville, there is a plethora of opportunities available. There are two State Resort Parks, Lake Barkley and Kentucky Dam Village; Mineral Mounds State Park; and, The Land Between the Lakes National Recreation Area. The Trace which has been featured in several national motorcycle magazines runs through the middle of the trace. The National Quilt Museum is located in Paducah. Before you leave the state, there is the Wickliffe Mounds State Historic Site.

While I have ridden the section between Maysville and Cynthiana many times, I tend to stick with the Parkways when west of Lexington. One of these days I will have to skip them to see how it was to travel across the state before they existed.

It's riding season again and as with every year, this marks the beginning of our best chance to attract new members to our group. In the past we have tried exhibiting our hobby at various locations: malls, motorcycle dealerships, etc. This has not proven to get us the attention that we deserve, and with a very busy calendar this year, wouldn't you rather be out riding than sitting in a parking lot? I know that I would. So this year we will be trying something different. We will be ducking!!

What is ducking you say?? Well, we have acquired some very friendly little ducks who have agreed to wear our Chapter information on their bellies. While you're out riding, if you see a motorcycle or trike sitting somewhere and you think that it would look happier if it was with Chapter G, you simply place a little happy duck on the seat and let it do its magic. The hope is that we play on the riders curious nature and they check out our wonderful website. And, if they like what they see, maybe they will come and check us out. It's simple, fun, and doesn't cost us any time sitting in a parking lot waiting for the riders to come to us.

So get a couple of ducks and keep them in your bike/ trike. You will know when the opportunity is right. Let's just do what we love to do, and get out and ride! If you need ducks, just let me know, or come to a get-together and pick some up!

Group riding is different from solo riding because not only is each rider responsible for their own safety, but they also have a responsibility for interacting safely with the other riders in the group. In the past, sharing information between riders was easily accomplished with the CB radio. The CB radio is a great tool, but only one person at a time can convey information. Newer communication tools using Bluetooth technology can link riders together instantly in a type of “party line.” But in either case, every rider must have the equipment on board to share information. As Wing’d Rider grows and adds new members riding all brands and styles of motorcycles, keeping everyone informed requires a universal tool. Common hand signals can be used by everyone at any time and is the fastest way to relay important information to keep everyone safe.



Speed Up Inexperienced groups will benefit most from this signal. Experienced groups rely more on body language. Use it to tell the rest of the group to match your pace by increasing their speed. Extend your arm and swing your palm in an upward direction to give the signal.



Slow Down This signal is useful because motorcycles generate intense engine-braking forces, which do not activate the rear-facing brake light. Extend your arm and swing your palm down toward the road to tell everyone in the group to slow down.



Follow Me Used to announce a new, often self-appointed group leader. Also used to segment a large group into a smaller group. Make the signal by extending your arm forward at the shoulder with your palm facing outward.



You Lead/Come AKA the “YOU! Follow me!” signal. It has 2 distinct parts. Start by pulling up alongside the rider you want to follow or lead. In one motion, point to their bike and then swing your arm forward. Repeat this motion until the other rider understands.



Road Hazard This is a “2 in 1” signal. The signal is different depending on whether the hazard is to the right or the left. If the hazard is on the left, point with your left arm. Point with your right foot if the hazard is on the right.



Single File An easy gesture. Extend your left index finger and bend your arm up to the sky. In other words, pretend the riders behind you are asking “How many?” and then indicate the answer by gesturing with your *left pointer finger*.



Double File Bend your left arm at the elbow and point to the sky with your index and middle fingers. Do not forget to include your index finger.



Turn Signal On To make a “blinking” gesture using your left hand, alternate between extending your fingers and making a fist. Use this signal to let another rider know he left his blinker on, allowing him to save face during the next comfort or refreshment stop.



Pull Off Indicate to the rest of the group to pull off of the highway, either immediately or at the next exit. The pull off signal is given when the reason for the stop is something other than a comfort or refreshment stop.



Fuel When riding with most groups, running out of gas will earn you a nickname you probably won't like. Communicate your need to refuel by pointing to your fuel tank using your left index finger.

Please be courteous to your fellow riders, and signal important points, as necessary. Also, when another rider signals, be sure to pass it back for everyone else.

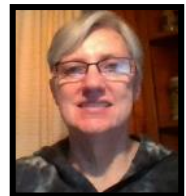

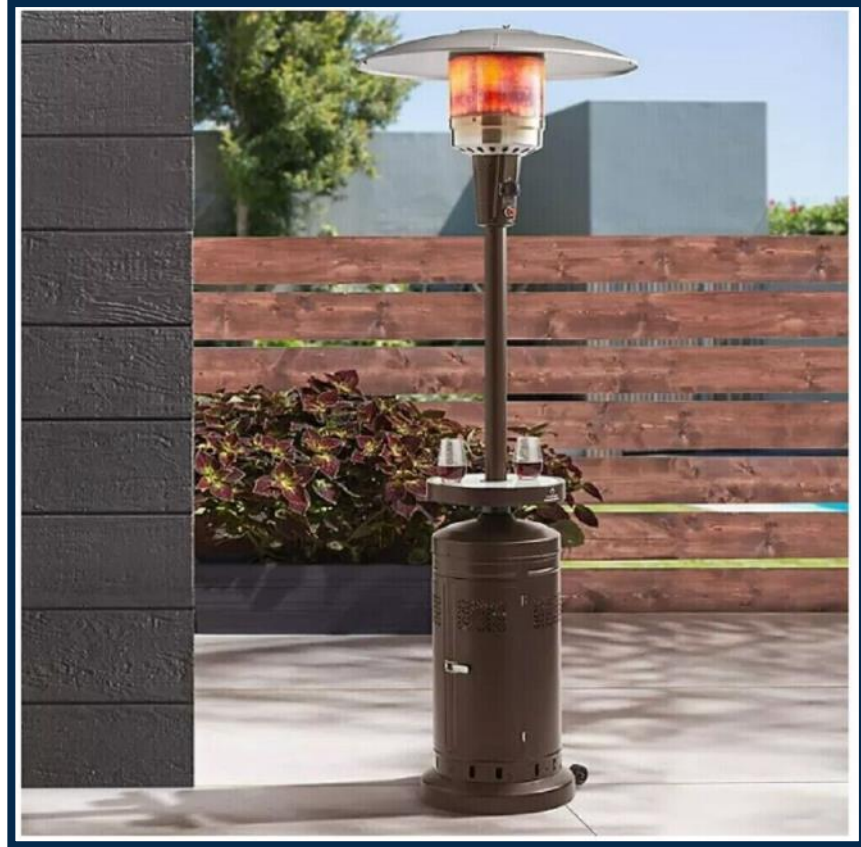
