The day ended with a Prom. Boy do we clean up good. Congratulations to our Prom King and Queen — Ron Harper and Donita Nardi.







- 1. How should you keep your body position when stopping quickly?





Origin of Valentine's Day

Valentine's Day is a holiday celebrated on February 14th every year.

The holiday has its roots in the ancient Roman festival of Lupercalia, which was celebrated in mid-February to mark the beginning of spring and to honor the god of fertility

1. The festival involved the sacrifice of animals and the whipping of women with animal hides to promote fertility 2. The Catholic Church later adopted the festival and renamed it Saint Valentine's Day, after one of the many Christian martyrs named Valentine

2. The exact origin of the holiday is shrouded in mystery, but it is believed that Saint Valentine was a priest who performed secret marriages for young couples in defiance of the Roman Emperor Claudius II's ban on marriage for young men

3. The holiday has since evolved into a day of love and romance, with people exchanging gifts, cards, and flowers with their loved ones

The first commercially printed Valentine's Day card was produced in 1913 by Hallmark, known as Hall Brothers at that time.
