# My Most Memorable Ride

While trying to think about my most memorable ride, I quickly realized that I have so many that I can't narrow it down to one. I've been fortunate enough to have ridden in 40 of the 48 lower states, both with others and alone. I've made two documented Iron Butt Rides (1000 miles in less than 24 hours), plus a couple other ones that I didn't document. I've completed the Master Traveler Award for the Iron Butt Association, which required getting at least 50 National Park or National Historic Site stamps in at least 25 different states in less than 1 year, as well as camping trips and numerous multi-day trips, and I've thoroughly enjoyed all of them. I've learned so much from others while traveling, as well as a few lessons that I picked up myself, and one of those lessons is what I've decided to share.

When I first joined GWRRA and began attending Chapter G gatherings, one of the things that grabbed me pretty quickly was all the traveling stories I heard people talking about. I had never taken a trip on a motorcycle up to that point and I couldn't wait to give it a try. The first trip Leah and I made together on the bike was to Branson, Missouri. We had ridden together many times, but just short-day rides, so this was brand new to both of us. I had recently purchased all the fancy riding gear, consisting of Joe Rocket Riding Suits, and the weather on our departure morning was chilly with a misty rain, so the suits were perfect. As we got into St. Louis, the weather had gotten pretty warm and those suits were quickly becoming uncomfortable, and Leah tried to persuade me to take them off. Unfortunately, we didn't have a trailer, and the saddle bags and trunk were packed so tightly that we couldn't have put anything else in there including one of those pressed penny souvenirs you see everywhere. She accepted that we were going to have to keep them on, and we made it safely to our room in Branson, where we were able to put the suits away and enjoy our weeklong stay. The riding in the area was great and we accidentally discovered the town of Eureka Springs, Arkansas while we were out enjoying the Ozarks. Everything was just beautiful until we started packing for home and realized we were going to have to wear those suits again, and the weather forecast was for sunshine and warm temperatures. Shortly after we began the trip home, I had to stop for gas and the begging began to remove the suits. She even suggested to hold them while we rode. Those are some pretty expensive suits and I wasn't about to take the chance of her letting go of something, so I insisted that we wear them. As I pulled out of that gas station, my thoughts began to become obsessed with the fact that I was going to have to get a trailer if I ever expected her to travel with me again.

Our next big trip was to Wing-Ding 32 in Des Moines, Iowa, and you better believe I had a trailer for that trip, and have had one on every other trip she has taken with me. I call it her traveling suitcase. I'd be willing to bet that I'm not the only one who has a story like this. Stay safe my friends and Leah and I, along with her traveling suitcase hope to see you on the road soon.

Are you looking for a way to put some miles on the motorcycle while also viewing some of Mother Nature's finest wonders? Why not visit some of Kentucky's waterfalls. You might also get some exercise while you are at it.

The largest such phenomenon in the state is Cumberland Falls on Highway 90 in Corbin. "Known as the 'Niagara of the South,' the 125-foot curtain of water falling into a boulder-strewn gorge is dramatic day or night. But it is only during a full moon that you can see the moonbow, a phenomenon not found anywhere else in the Western Hemisphere! The "moonbow," also called a white rainbow or lunar rainbow, is formed just like a rainbow—light is refracted in tiny water droplets—and appears for the two or so days, as long as the sky is clear, on either end of the full moon." (KY State Parks Website) In June, the Moonbow will be visible on the nights of June 9 – 13. In July, the dates are the 8th thru the 12th. The Park offers a lodge, cabins or camping if you want to make an overnight or longer stay. As is the case with all the KY State Resort Parks, there is a restaurant. You can also visit Eagle Falls at this park. The 44-foot-high Falls is accessed by a 3-mile loop trail.

Not far from Cumberland Falls is Yahoo Falls in the Big South Fork National River and Recreation Area. At 113 feet tall, it is considered one of the tallest waterfalls in the state. The hike to and from the falls is 4.2 miles. If you want to hike an additional .75 miles, you can view Yahoo Arch on the same trail.

While in this area, you can visit Princess Falls in Stearns. This Falls is on Lick Creek in Daniel Boone National Forest. You will need to take the 2-mile long Sheltowee Trace Trail to reach the 13-foothigh Falls.

Taking KY Route 92 west to the Monticello area will lead you to Town Creek Falls. Located on Elk Spring Creek, Town Creek Falls has a 50-foot drop and is 80 feet wide. Continuing west on KY Route 90 and north on KY Route 734 will lead you to the Seventy-Six Falls Recreation Area. 76 Falls is where Indian Creek meets Lake Cumberland. The reviews promote visiting the Falls from a boat on the Lake.

There are still more waterfalls to see in the Commonwealth, but this will give you a start to adding those miles for the Chapter G annual mileage contest.

With the return of favorable weather, most of us have gotten back to riding. Many of us like to ride in groups, enjoying the hobby we love with others of like mind. Group motorcycle riding is a philosophy that emphasizes a blend of safety, communication, and camaraderie while simultaneously requiring riders to be aware of their surroundings, to maintain proper spacing, and to communicate effectively. It is about riding as a team, where everyone relies on and respects each other to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience.

Here are some important points of group motorcycle riding philosophy:

**Safety:** proper spacing, staggered formations, and awareness of road conditions.

**Communication:** hand signals and CB/Bluetooth communication to alert other riders about changes in speed, direction, or potential hazards.

**Responsibility:** realizing that each rider is responsible for their own safety and the safety of the others in the group.

**Respect:** acknowledging and collaborating with the leader, the group, and other road users.

**Having fun:** emphasizing the shared experience and camaraderie of riding together, while maintaining safety and respect.

Group riding is an active, constantly changing, and dynamic event. Conditions on the road are always in flux due to traffic, road conditions, actions from other users, and natural occurrences such as weather and animal activity. This requires a foundation of trust among the participants in the ride. Group riding does not excuse the rider from sound judgement or safe practices. Each rider is responsible for his own decisions, regardless of the group dynamic.

There are several ways each rider can provide the respect and consideration he expects from the others in the group. It is important to maintain lane position especially in tight turns and in traffic. Riders on the inside of a right-hand turn should try their best to stay on the right side of the road, especially when turning from a stop, as at an intersection. At stop signs and traffic lights, the group should collapse together, with each rider moving up next to the person ahead. Proper lane position will normally allow enough room for a bike and a trike to stop next to each other. Close formation at a stop allows the group to get through the intersection in less time, reducing the exposure of all the riders to cross traffic and left turning vehicles.

Remember that your actions have consequences. Every time you brake (for an obstacle or entering a turn), accelerate, or decelerate, you immediately affect ALL of the riders behind you. Any sudden action you make will require a sudden reaction from ALL of the other riders. Always do your best and signal your intentions well ahead to avoid causing panic among those riders who are following you.

Be aware of the differences in the vehicles in your group. Generally, if a vehicle participating in the group ride has less than three wheels, that vehicle will have a great deal of difficulty staying upright without rider input. And the slower that vehicle is moving, the more rider input is required. Group rides these days usually consist of more multi-wheeled vehicles than two-wheeled motorcycles. Many of the operators of these multi-wheeled vehicles were skilled riders of two wheels. Maybe this describes you. Do you remember riding on two wheels and the effort it took to keep the bike balanced and smooth during slow speed operation?

We all know we should ride our own ride, and we are responsible for our own actions. But this does not mean that you can do what you want without regard to the effects on other road users. We all have responsibility to each other when we interact on the highway, regardless of the setting. Using the highway is a privilege, not a right. Be respectful and patient so we all get along and arrive alive.

Turns out he grew up only 3 miles from it and most of the inside is original, including the blackboard. They have live music and an open mike night every week. The inside is decorated in a music theme, as Dave was in a band and has a huge love of music. He was very appreciative of our group choosing his restaurant.

Interestingly enough, we again had some good Samaritans holding traffic so our group of 11 bikes could make turns. Makes you feel good that some people can spare a few extra minutes a do something nice for others!

Again, many thanks to Donita who selflessly offered to ride tail again, and to Jerry for helping out on the ride. We can't do all we do without these folks who take on these extra duties to make the ride safe and fun for all. THANK YOU!!!






