I was recently reading the August issue of Rider Magazine which its main theme is the upcoming 100 anniversary of U S Route 66 in 2026. The articles told tales of the wonderful adventures the authors had experienced over the years on "The Mother Road." They reminded me of my own misadventures on sections of that old highway back in 2011.

To set the stage, let me explain the genesis of the trip. My friend and riding buddy, Jim, at that time liked to take long trips, most of the time on a whim. We had taken many trips east and south to Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Tennessee. Several trips were made north and west to Illinois, Wisconsin, Yellowstone National Park and Glacier National Park. There were two common things about all these trips. He would ask me to plan the route and he would always cut the trips short after 3 or 4 days on the road. At the time I was riding a 1995 Goldwing and my friend was riding a newer Harley.

The Route 66 trip was no different. I suggested we leave late morning on a Saturday and stop somewhere south of Chicago. This would allow us to start Route 66 in Chicago on a Sunday morning early and avoid the congestion downtown. Needless to say, on Saturday afternoon Jim decided we should go on into Chicago and start Route 66 then. However, when we got into downtown Chicago there was an event happening with all the streets crowded. After sitting in traffic for several hours, the Goldwing overheated and would not start for over an hour and half. After we finally got started, we only rode south for about an hour where we would have stopped when we reached the outskirts of Chicago. On Sunday, we followed Route 66 to Springfield, Illinois, where we visited the various Lincoln Historical Sites. Jim decided that we needed to make time, so we took Interstate 55 to St. Louis where we once again rode a portion of the Mother Road. This pattern was repeated most days with us taking some of Route 66 then jumping on an interstate. When we finally reached Los Angeles, California, the following Saturday, we wound up staying in a less than desirable area, as we have not made any reservations. The next morning, when we went to leave, Jim discovered someone had tried to steal his motorcycle during the night. They attempted to remove the ignition. I had parked in a different section of the underground garage and no attempt had been made to abscond with my bike. I inquired at the hotel front desk to view video from their surveillance cameras, only to learn the cameras were inoperable. The police were notified who just made a phone report of the incident. Several phone

calls were made before reaching a Harley Davidson dealership that was open on Sunday. Jim was able to start his bike and we made a stop at the Dealership, but they were unable to make any repairs. They suggested he just keep riding and have it repaired upon returning home. The original plan was for us to follow U.S. 50 back and we only rode portion of it, so he could get back.

Are We a Dying Breed??

As Membership Enhancement for our Chapter, one of my jobs is to make sure that our members are enjoying their Chapter experience and that we are for the most part a happy, healthy, Chapter. With Chapter G, this is not a difficult task, but the other part of the job is a little more challenging. I'm charged with growing the chapter to KEEP it going, and this I find to be a bit more difficult. I am continually approached by members who make statements about the dwindling size of the chapter, or that fact that new members are few and far between. I know we have all put thought into these questions, so I am providing a little bit of research.

As it turns out, motorcycles sales as a whole are dropping in many major markets in the US and Europe. There are many reasons for this decline: Economic factors including higher interest rates, inflation, and market instability have made a high-price purchase more risky than before. But social and behavioral changes are the ones that might seal the deal for the future of the leisure motorcycle hobby. Baby boomers have always been big supporters of motorcycling, but this demographic is now aging out of the market. The younger folks don't seem to be hopping on the bandwagon at a comparable rate which is causing an overall decrease in riders. Also, younger generations seem to have different ideas when it comes to fun and entertainment. You may have noticed how popular computer gaming, social media, and television have become. Look outside on a nice afternoon in the summer and you will see...well, not much. The younger generation really seems to like the air conditioning. And one more factor that is causing a drop in riders is the everincreasing sale of EV and hybrid vehicles. How many of you first started riding because it took less gasoline to run your bike and you could save money going to work? Well, electric vehicles and hybrids can run for less than your motorcycle, and that is providing you actually have to "GO" to work, because there are lots of people now who just work from home.

So what is the answer?? Are we a dying breed? If we want to keep that from happening we have to instill in our children and grandchildren the importance of having actual (flesh and blood) friends. We need to let them know how much fun we have together and how, in some cases, the support that we give and get from each other is something that you just can't get online. When I am questioned about the lifeline of the chapter, I always say, that I don't know what will happen down the road, but I'm gonna ride this wave as far as it will take me. I hope you'll grab your board and ride along.

Welcome to August and the arrival (finally) of the heat and humidity of summer. But the heat of the daytime is nothing like the heat in your exhaust system. Combine that with the humidity in the air, the byproducts of combustion which are basically anhydrous acids, and the fact that a motorcycle exhaust system is unprotected metal on the inside, and you have a recipe for rust and corrosion. Our exhaust systems are very well made, but after many years even the best exhaust systems will start to show the effects of aging.

The first place to check is any clamp or fastener. These places tend to catch and keep the road grime which also holds the acid rain that can eat pits into the pipes, even into the chrome plating. Next, check around the welds. By their very nature, the welds are subject to early failure due to the energy put into them during the welding process. This makes the metal in the welded area more prone to the effects of oxidation. And the third place to check is any sharp angle in the formed metal fittings and tubing of the exhaust system. Sharp angles tend to act as stress risers, where any force on the metal, be it expansion and contraction from thermal changes, or flexing from vibration from the engine or roadway, tend to be focused and lead to cracking. These cracks again tend to attract dirt and moisture.

If your bike is new or in really fine condition without much rust on the exhaust system, then prevention is easy, mainly consisting of washing and periodic scrubbing followed by some aluminized paint around the welds. If you or the previous owner have been less than diligent in the care of the exhaust system, and you find some cracks, there is still hope. Several products on the market can extend the service life of your pipes. Some are high temperature epoxies. Others are mixes of high temperature polymers and metal dust, like Blue Magic[®] Quik Steel[™]. This product is applied on warm days above 80 degrees Fahrenheit and is applied directly to the damaged area. Liberal applications spread widely over the surrounding surface help to hold the area together. After four hours of initial curing, it is time to go for a ride to finish-cure the repair. The heat in the exhaust makes this product stronger.

After riding in a ferocious windstorm in Nebraska on our way to Rapid City, South Dakota. We felt like the trike was more difficult to handle than the motorcycles that we had owned in the past. We found the somewhat logical answer via Copilot:

Riding in a windstorm can be quite challenging, regardless of the type of vehicle. However, there 2-wheel motor-cycle and a trike that might make one easier to handle than the other in such conditions. ile and harder to man 2-wheel motor-billity in a windstorm, handle than the other in such conditions.

A 2-wheel motorcycle is generally more agile and can be easier to maneuver quickly. However, it is also more susceptible to being pushed around by strong winds due to its lighter weight and smaller contact area with the ground. This can make it more difficult to maintain stability

and control in a windstorm.

On the other hand, a trike, with its three wheels, offers greater stability and a larger contact area with the ground. This can make it less likely to be pushed around by the wind, providing a more stable ride. However, trikes are typically less agile and harder to maneuver quickly compared to 2-wheel motorcycles.

In summary, while a trike might offer more stability in a windstorm, a 2-wheel motorcycle could be easier to maneuver. The choice ultimately depends on the rider's comfort and experience with each type of vehicle. Stay safe and ride carefully!




