

For motorcycle enthusiasts, the open road offers torcyclists and sports cars drivers to help local more than just a way to get from point A to point B. It's about freedom, connection, and pure riding pleasure. And while fuel efficiency and longer rides are always on the minds of seasoned riders, there's a surprising way to rack up more miles: ride scenic.

That's right—exploring scenic routes can not only make your rides more enjoyable, but they can also help you extend your time in the saddle. With smoother terrain, less stop-and-go traffic, and fewer city interruptions, Kentucky's scenic byways offer the perfect conditions for both your soul and your fuel tank.

Here are a few breathtaking roads where you'll be glad to ride longer—and your motorcycle might just thank you, too.

Morehead to Louisa ROUTE: KY-32

This 2-lane mountain road twists and curves through the forests of Eastern Kentucky, and stretches across open farmland. This Kentucky motorcycle route is usually very well maintained and is a great country road for riding, especially nice in the fall or spring. Riders will experience beautiful Kentucky mountaintop scenery, as well as of Yatesville Lake. With fast, sweeping curves, mountain twisties, and beautiful scenery, find out why many say motorcycles were invented for rides like Route 32!

The Rattlesnake **ROUTE: KY-192**

Located just north of the Tennessee border and west of Interstate 75, the Rattlesnake winds through the foothills of Daniel Boone National Forest from London to Somerset, Kentucky. The road has excellent pavement and sports 150 turns in 12 miles. The road officially runs from Hwy 192 and 1193 west to Buck Creek; however, the next five miles have some great curves too so plan to make the run all the way to Somerset. In 2016, the state officially named Highway 192 "The Rattlesnake" in the hopes of attracting mo-

tourism. Be sure to stop at the Souvenir Shack at Brake on the Snake for some souvenirs, as well as the Vanhook Falls Trailhead.

Burlington to Bedford ROUTES: KY 18, KY-338, US 42

Much of this rural KY motorcycle route takes you along the Ohio River and Big Bone Lick State Park . Ride along some of Kentucky's beautiful horse farms, with winding country roads through the hills. Route 42 is a relaxing ride with nice views overlooking the river. Traffic is usually light on these roads, and there are some great twists and turns to enjoy while taking in the country road scenery through the Kentucky hills.

Cumberland Falls Road ROUTE: KY-90

Route 90 through Cumberland Falls Highway takes riders through a small portion of the beauty Southern Kentucky has to offer. Starting in Parkers Lake, take Route 90 to U.S. 25W. It's a great KY motorcycle ride through the state's dense forests. Be sure to stop at Cumberland Falls State Park to check out a glimpse of Cumberland Falls (as mentioned in last month's article) which sits right in the middle of this motorcycle route. For a longer loop ride, head down Route 27 and back east along Route 478. But whatever road you take in this area, the countryside is beautiful as you navigate the rolling hills in this part of the state.

WAWA and other thoughts to Ponder

WAWA.... What a stupid name for a gas station / convenience store. As soon as the advertisements began about the new WA-WA chain opening stores in our area, the craziness of the name began to carve a hole. It was on the radio, the television, even on the news! And each time I heard it, the hole got a little deeper. WHY would anyone call their business WAWA?!?!?



And then one day I couldn't take it any more...so I Googled it.

"The name "Wawa" for the convenience store and gas station chain comes from the town of Wawa, Pennsylvania, where the company's first dairy farm and corporate headquarters were located. The town's name, in turn, is derived from the Ojibwe Native American word "we'we," which means "snow goose" <u>according to the Ojibwe People's Dictionary</u>. The company's logo, featuring a goose, is a direct reference to this origin. "

And suddenly it all made sense. But then, almost immediately, I felt the onset of "postknowledge" depression. It occurred to me that technology is quickly removing the "wonder" from our vocabulary. When I was a kid and "wondered" about something, my resources for discovery were my parents, teachers, friends, and of course the Word Book Encyclopedia. If you wanted to know it, you had to work for it. And through the process of learning, you got satisfaction in achieving a goal. Today our world is all about instant gratification, and I'm not sure that is such a good thing.

At RVR we still offer you "wonder". Come to an Ice Cream Ride, and you'll wonder where you will end up and how you will get there. Come on a Lunch Ride and wonder what joy you will find on the way and the secrets you may learn at the destination. Drop in to a get-together and the jokes may make you "wonder" why you came! (just kidding on that one...of course you will have a great time wondering what stories you will hear from our amazing members) We offer you so much more than you can Google. Come join us and find your sense of wonder.



A panda walks into a bar and gobbles some beer nuts. Then he pulls out a gun, fires it in the lary palp which detects the carair, and heads for the door. "Hey!" shouts the bartender, but the panda yells back, "I'm a feet. As a result, people who panda. Google me!" and continues out the door. Sure enough, panda: "A treeclimbing mammal with distinct black-and-white coloring. Eats shoots and leaves." This month I would like to present information about the environmental concerns of our sport. As an outdoor activity, we are subject to all the critters Mother Nature has seen fit to provide. Some of these pests can cause irritation and distraction, but there are things we can do to lessen their impact on our fun.

Let's examine the Mosquito. Although science has yet to pinpoint what mosquitoes consider an ideal victim, there is a tremendous amount of research being conducted on what compounds and odors people exude that might be attractive to mosquitoes. But with 400 different compounds to examine, researchers are just beginning to scratch the surface.

It's not dinner they are sucking out of you. While male mosquitos do not bite people -- female mosquitoes bite us to harvest proteins from our blood to develop fertile eggs. People with Type O blood are bitten nearly twice as often as those with Type A, while people with all other blood types fall somewhere in the middle.

Mosquitoes locate their victims areas naturally have more rousing an organ called a maxilbon dioxide in a person's breath from as far away as 164 simply exhale more of the gas over time—generally, larger people—have been shown to attract more mosquitoes than others. This is one of the reasons why children get bitten less often than adults.

In addition to carbon dioxide, mosquitoes find victims at closer range by smelling the lactic acid, uric acid, ammonia and other substances expelled via their sweat, and are also attracted to people with higher body temperatures. Strenuous exercise increases the buildup of lactic acid and heat in your body. Genetics also influence the amount of uric acid and other substances naturally emitted by each person. People with high concentrations of steroids or cholesterol on their skin surface attract mosquitoes. Pregnant women have been found to attract roughly twice as many mosquito bites as others, likely because they exhale about 21 percent more carbon dioxide and are on average about 1.26 degrees Fahrenheit warmer than others.

Other research has suggested that the particular types and volume of bacteria that naturally live on our skin affect our attractiveness to mosquitoes. This might be why mosquitoes are especially prone to biting our ankles and feet as these

bust bacteria colonies.

Just a single 12-ounce beer can make you more attractive because drinking alcoholic beverages increases the amount of ethanol excreted in sweat, and it increases body temperature.

Mosquitoes use vision in addition to scent to locate humans, so wearing colors that stand out (black, dark blue or red) may make you easier to find. To minimize your risk of being bitten, wear clothes that cover exposed skin. Insect repellants made with the chemical DEET or Picaridin have been proven effective to repel mosquitoes. As a natural alternative, mosquito plants and citronella candles work well too.

In summary, if you are a Type O, exercising, pregnant woman in a black shirt, I suggest staying indoors. For the rest of us, stay clean, drink water, wear light colored clothing, and use an effective insect repellant. Be sure to stock the first aid kit on your bikes with itch relief for when these pests get past your best efforts of prevention.

WATCH OUT FOR MOTORCYCLES

Hello Chapter G,

Watch out for Motorcycles, we say! What we mean by this and how others understand our words often have two different meanings.

First, other drivers should pay attention and see motorcycles on the road. They need to check twice to see if motorcycles are next to them, behind them or in front of them. Drivers should watch for stopped motorcycles at intersections, avoid pulling out in front of them, keep from running into the back of them, and be aware not to cut in front of them during lane changes. Keeping a safe distance behind a motorcycle can be important since motorcycles can stop at a shorter distance than a car.

Here is a second interpretation of "Watch out for motorcycles."

Inconsiderate motorcycle riders are everywhere. Luanne and I have family and friends that say motorcycle riders should watch out for cars. Many riders cut in and out of lanes with speeds that are excessive, following distances that are dangerous, and braking habits that don't give a car a chance to avoid an accident. Inconsiderate riders give motorcyclists a bad reputation. Many riders with dark clothing make it difficult to see, motorcycle lights that are dim, and improper turn signals. Some people don't like it when motorcycle riders run stop signs as a group, hold up traffic when riding on the interstate or park in areas that are not designated as a parking space. Motorcycle riders should be aware of their actions so motorists will respect them.

As motorists and cycle riders, we need to continue to present safe, friendly practices that make our presence noticeable and safe in the eyes of the public. Let's all continue to ride safely.


