Chapter G received 3 recognitions at the Blast this years:


- Chapter G had the most members pre-registered. We have around 23 total at The Blast.

"It takes a village." How many times have you heard this in your lifetime? How many times have you said it yourself? The root of this idea is in the word community. From Dictionary.com we find the following information (edited for space considerations):

com·mu·ni·ty

/kəˈmyoonədē/

noun

- a group of people living in the same place or having a particular characteristic in common.
- the people of a district or country considered collectively, especially in the context of social values and responsibilities.
- a feeling of fellowship with others, as a result of sharing common attitudes, interests, and goals.

From the Merriam-Webster we also get similar information:

- a unified body of individuals: such as the people with common interests living in a particular area
- a body of persons of common and especially professional interests scattered through a larger society

And from the Cambridge Dictionary:

 the people living in one particular area or people who are considered as a unit because of their common interests, social group, or nationality

When I was researching this month's article, I also came across the following chart that shows the use of the word community in various written forms of communication during the last few hundred years.



I joined GWRRA KY Chapter G in 2009 because I was looking for a group of people with whom I could ride and learn about motorcycles and motorcycling. I had been to a few rallies, but to each one I went by myself, because I only wanted to take advantage of the demo rides the factories offered there. And I had never camped (not even once) until I joined Chapter G. I had no idea what to expect or what to bring or how to act.


Hello Chapter G,

The trip was beautiful, the weather was great, and it was more than we expected. Upon our arrival, the covered bridge routes were laid out to navigate easily in a car. We were thinking about taking this trip on a motorcycle but after the large amount of gravel roads, it would be unsafe for anyone on 2 wheels. We could take a trip there as a group if we went in cars at which it would be a beautiful weekend. The scenery is great, and the covered bridges are beautiful, and the state parks, lodges and hotels are very nice.

After taking our trip, here is some information we found on the internet that would be helpful in planning a motorcycle trip:

- 1. **Research the Area**: Research the routes, roads and hazards that you may encounter.
- 2. **Plan Your Route and Book Your Lodging ahead of time**: Use a reliable GPS or mapping app to plan your route and have a physical map as a backup.
- 3. **Check the Weather** and pack the gear that you will need for the weather that you will encounter.
- 4. Pack Essentials: Pack your clothing, medication, first aid kit, tools and a tire repair kit.
- 5. **Safety Gear**: Always make sure to wear appropriate safety gear, including a helmet, gloves, jacket, and boots.
- 6. **Stay Connected**: Inform someone about your travel plans and check in with them regularly. Carry a fully charged mobile phone and consider bringing a portable charger.

Enjoy the Journey: If you are not feeling well, drowsy or sick, do not ride. Also, make sure you are hydrated. Take your time and enjoy the ride and stop to take in the scenery, meet new people, and make the most of your adventure.






