SPONSOR'S BLOCK

Before meeting Rick I had only been on a motorcycle once – and that was when I was a teen; my mom rode on my cousin's Harley with him, and I couldn't let her show me up.

But I was petrified!

Fast forward to 1996 and marrying Rick. Our riding started out on a 1982 Yamaha XS400 RJ. In 2006 we bought our first Goldwing in celebration of 10 yrs of marriage. We joined the "G" in 2009. Since then, we've ridden in weather of all kinds – 100 degrees at 6 am riding to Ft Wayne, rain the ENTIRE trip down and while in attendance at Wing Ding in Greenville SC, winds so strong crossing the plains headed out West that I couldn't hold my head up, snow on Beartooth Pass... While the conditions were varied one thing that remained constant was, I never experienced fear – apprehension, concern, aggravation – yes, but not fear.

That all changed this year when we headed to South Dakota through Nebraska. The trip started off great with Rick leading a group of 6 bikes on a trip that he had planned. Day one went great, we met our mileage goal, the eating stops went as planned and the accommodations were great.

As we headed into Nebraska the winds started to pick up and we could tell we were in for rough weather. We stopped to gear up and continued down the road. I've ridden many miles on the bike but have never had it move sideways – with no way to control it. At one point I was certain we were going to be pulled

off the road. But Rick managed to get the bike under control and the entire group pulled off to the side of the road. We tucked our heads, our bodies tense as we fought to stay on the bike and our hearts filled with prayer. We rode out that storm and continued on our way – all of us pretty shaken. Little did we know that was just a preview of what we were to face further down the road.

The group pulled into a gas station for fuel and to regroup. While there we met some Storm Chasers. They quickly advised us that we were headed into even worse weather and recommended that we either stop for the night or at least for a break. We were less than 20 miles from our final destination, so we opted to go to – DAIRY QUEEN!!! It was just across the road from the gas station. ☺ We rested and grabbed dinner. It was getting dark and the road and sky ahead appeared clear. So, we put on our gear and mounted our bikes. As we were riding, I was texting our oldest son letting him know that we'd made it thru the weather and it appeared as if we were in the clear – @ 10 miles from our hotel, then heard an OH SH__! come across the radio. When I looked up the sky was filled with lightning and it was as bright as if it were day. The rain started and we rode only a couple miles before Rick let the group know we were pulling over. A police officer stopped to tell us that we were in for VERY ROUGH weather and wished us luck. Remember, we were in the flat lands of Nebraska – no overheads, no where to hide. So, we sat and waited

for the storm to hit. We held onto the bikes, ducked our heads and PRAYED. The bikes shook as we were pelted with hail and wondered if the bikes were going to stay upright. I can truly say I've never experienced fear like that. And I hope never to know that kind of fear again.

But the storm passed and we were safe. That incident gave me a TRUE APPRECIATION for my husband and his insistence on safety (and the gear to go with it) ALL THE TIME. Being less than 10 miles from our destination, many leaders would have chosen to try and continue on our way. Fortunately for all on that ride, we pulled over. Had we not, I might not be here to share our story.

We experienced a few other obstacles on the rest of our trip – hospital stays, delayed flights... So, whenever I look back at what was in some ways the worst trip on the bike we've ever taken, I hope to also remember to be thankful for all my husband's safety quirks no matter how aggravating they can be, and for the blessing of traveling with my G family.

Remember to count your blessing this holiday season.




Fuel Part 2

The energy of gasoline and ethanol is stored in the Carbon-Hydrogen bond.

Ethanol's chemical formula is C_2H_5OH



Gasoline's chemical formula is C_8H_{18}



Examining the chemical formula of the two fuels clearly shows that gasoline has more energy per molecule and is one reason our motorcycles get less mileage from a gallon of standard retail gasoline with 10% ethanol than from a gallon of pure gasoline. Another reason is because the ethanol is blended with a denaturant to make it undrinkable. This chemical does not add any energy to the fuel. The amount of denaturant can be up to 2% of the volume of ethanol added.

Most gasoline available at retail pumps in the USA contains about 10% ethanol by volume. In 2023, about 330 million barrels of ethanol were blended into the 3.26 billion barrels (more than 137 billion gallons) of gasoline that were consumed.

The blending of ethanol with gasoline occurs in the United States to meet the requirements of the 1990 Clean Air Act and the Renewable Fuel Standard established in the Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007. There are three general categories of ethanol-gasoline blends: E10, E15, and E85. Most retail gasoline sold in the USA is E10, which contains up to 10% ethanol. E15 is gasoline blended with up to 15% ethanol. And likewise, E85 is gasoline blended with up to 85% ethanol. The ethanol content of the gasoline is usually indicated on the pump. According to the US Environmental Protection Agency, all motor vehicle engines can use E10 gasoline. However, our motorcycles, lawn mowers, side-by-sides, etc., are all considered "small engine" designs and normally are not designed to operate with E10. The ethanol in the gasoline blend can dry out seals and gaskets. The chemical denaturant left behind after evaporation can clog small orifices in the fuel system. Always check your owner's manual for the recommended fuel for your vehicle. Currently, only designated flex-fuel vehicles built after 2001 can use E15 or E85 fuels.




TRAVELING PLAQUE




